<u>Sunday Masses:</u> Saturday Vigil (anticipated Mass of Sunday) 4pm at St Pius X; Sunday 9.30am St Patrick's Parish Mass; 11.30am Traditional Latin Mass at St Patrick's;

NEW 4pm Sunday Parish Mass at St Pius X (preceded by Adoration and Confessions 3-3.45pm)

<u>Weekday Masses:</u> Monday there is no public Mass; Tuesday 9pm at St Pius X; Wednesday 10am and 6pm (Latin) at St Patrick's; Thursday 10am at St Pius X; Friday 1pm and 7pm (Latin) at St Patrick's

<u>Saturday Masses:</u> 1st Saturday of the month; Fatima Devotions 8.30am Adoration, Confessions, Rosary, 10am Latin Mass at St Patrick's. 2rd Saturday of the month; 10am Mass at St Pius X followed by Monthly Garden and Grounds cleaning. Last Saturday of the month; 10am Mass at St Patrick's followed by Monthly Church and Ground Cleaning.

<u>Confessions:</u> Sunday 9am-9.25am and again at 10.45am-11.15am at St Patrick's. Tuesday 8pm-8.40pm at St Pius X. Wednesday 9am-9.30am and again 5pm-5.40pm at St Patrick's. Thursday 9am-9.30am at St Pius X. Friday 12 Noon-12.40pm and again 6pm-6.40pm at St Patrick's. Saturday 3pm-3.45pm at St Pius X. Otherwise, on request.

Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament: usually accompanies confessions before weekday Masses.

Notice from the Parish Priest: Please don't hesitate to come and speak to Father Doohan in the Sacristy after Holy Mass, especially regarding making appointments, or about the Sacraments, it saves a great deal of time to be introduced to families seeking Christening etc rather than trying to arrange everything via email. Saint Vincent de Paul Society: Meeting again on Tuesday 26th October at 6.45pm in the Hall of St Pius X, new comers are welcome. SVDP parish collection (donations and funds) after Mass will continue on a weekly basis.

<u>Devotions:</u> the perpetual novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal at St Patrick's before the 10am Wednesday Mass, and the same for St Philomena before the 10am Mass on Thursdays at St Pius X. Beginning at 9.30am before Benediction. This means confessions on those days must end at 9.30am.

<u>Children's Catechism Classes:</u> Thursdays 4pm-5pm continuing through the current school holidays St Pius X First Holy Communion for those children whose parents chose to delay the date because of lockdown will finally make their Confessions 1.15pm 26th October & First Holy Communion Saturday 30th of October at 10am Mass in St Pius X.

Marriage Preparation: considering getting married 2021/2022? Please see Father ASAP as classes in common start soon. SIX SESSIONS starting Saturday 23rd of October 6pm-7.30pm each Saturday until Saturday 27th November at St Pius X.

Adult Catechism: Fridays 8pm in St Patrick's Parish Hall after the 7pm Mass. The class lasts one hour. We use the book "the Catechism Explained" by Father Francis Spirago. We read 20 pages each week as "home work", so if you're playing catch up at home, we are on page 70 for this coming Friday. Those thinking of converting to the faith should come along, but don't hesitate to introduce yourself to Father in the sacristy after Mass. However this class is for all Catholic adults also wanting to deepen their faith. N.B. no class on Friday 12th November.

<u>Novena to St Peregrine:</u> after the 10am Mass on the second Saturday of the month at St Pius X. The next date is therefore the 13th November. St Peregrine, amongst other things, is the patron saint of cancer patients.

<u>Blessings:</u> after the Masses on each first Sunday of the month (and the Vigil Mass closest to the first Sunday) opportunity for the blessing of oil, salt, and any piety items or "holy objects". Don't hesitate to ask individually in the sacristy as well.

<u>Priests' meetings:</u> May the Holy Spirit guide us further along the process of review for the days of recollection with the Bishop, Tuesday 16th-Thursday 18th November at St Mary's Kinnoull, which will involve further evaluation of questionaries, interviews, and the exchange of important up to date parochial & demographic information in light of this period of the pandemic, for future planning.



ACN's Worldwide Prayer Campaign, 18 October at 9am (or throughout the day)

The focus of the prayer campaign is worldwide unity and peace. It is an invitation to remember the words of Our Lady of Fatima that the childlike and trusting prayer of the Rosary can truly change the world and bring peace. "In many countries, children in particular are suffering from the effects of war and persecution," according to Father Martin Barta, the Spiritual Assistant to ACN International. He believes that the Rosary campaign is a good opportunity for children to pray together and express their solidarity. Prayer materials for the campaign are available in 27 languages, including, for example, Arabic and the West African Hausa language. Children from no fewer than 136 different countries and on every continent took part in the most recent annual event. From Argentina to Cuba to India. The children's Rosary campaign was initiated in 2005 in the Venezuelan capital, Caracas. While a number of children were praying the rosary at a wayside shrine, several of the people present recalled that Saint Padre Pio had said: "When one million children pray the rosary, the world will change." The campaign quickly spread across the world. ACN has supported the campaign since 2008 and took over the organisation of the entire event two years ago. Join us for this year's event.
