Dear Parishioners,

Christ has Risen, Alleluia! He has Risen indeed, Alleluia!

Every grace and blessing be upon you and your families in this wonderful Paschal Season!

Thank you to everyone who has contributed by their prayer, time, or material help, to make the Easter liturgy possible.

You will have noticed a change in the schedule with the introduction of a Vigil Mass at St Patrick's, beginning on Easter Saturday at 6pm. There is only one Vigil at St Pius X, at 4pm and not at 5.15pm. This now gives each of the three "communities" two Sunday Masses each. That being said, as Catholics we are welcome in any of God's Houses, at any Mass time; that is the freedom and privilege of God's Children, wherever we go, we are at home. Anyone is welcome to attend the Latin Masses at St Patrick's, anyone is welcome to attend the Parish Masses at St Pius X or St Patrick's regardless of where you live in the city (or outside it). For those unable to access the internet, the Presbytery telephone **01382 778 449** is where you should leave your request for registration for the time being. It would be sensible in the future that we set up an "internet buddy system" where someone with internet access is paired up with someone without it, so that they can search and see if they can register a place in advance. In Holy Week I had dozens and dozens of calls to work through, which is to be expected, but not something that is sustainable long term.

The various times of Confession provided are opportunities also for private prayer in church. It may only prove a short visit to the Blessed Sacrament, but it will be worthwhile to nourish the soul. Jesus loves us to come and pay a wee visit. Also, even if you're not registered for the Mass that follows immediately on from the Confession times, you can come just for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance. There is always a fifteen-minute gap from the end of Confessions until the start of Mass, enough time to leave when not staying for Mass.

This newsletter reflects the times for the next three weeks, up until the next government review of the current guidelines. On Monday April 26<sup>th</sup> there will be the easing of restrictions for weddings and funerals, with the number cap rising from 20 to 50 attendees. Perhaps there will also be advice given - or advance notice - about other changes for places of worship, the results of which will also determine the number of Masses offered etc. There are already plans for the decreasing of capacity constraints by the beginning of May and in the middle of June.

May I give a gentle reminder that as we are still unable to "place the plate round", we rely on everyone remembering to deposit their weekly offering in the collection boxes at the entrance of each of the churches. Thank you.
